Re: Charity, Non-Uniform Days and Uniform

As you will be aware, as a school we are very proud of our students and the way they demonstrate the Core Values, in particular their responsibility and leadership qualities in terms of charity fundraising. It is to this end that we will continue to formalise the non-uniform days thus allowing students to show their support for a range of causes in addition to their individual tutor group charities. The non-uniform days will be on the following dates:

Friday 17th Nov 2017 – in support of Children In Need (National charity) and a percentage of proceeds for Fairy Bricks in memory of Tatiana Stankovic-Davis.

Friday 15th December 2017 – End of term (proceeds towards individual tutor group charity)

Friday 23rd March 2018 - Sport Relief & British Red Cross (International charities)

Friday 29th June 2018 – Wrong Trousers Day (Local charity)

Friday 6th July 2018 – End of term (proceeds towards individual tutor group charity)

I do appreciate that we ask students for a contribution to charity of £1 for each non-uniform day, and I would like to emphasise that there is absolutely no pressure for a student to participate (they are welcome to wear full school uniform as usual), however recognition and support of these charities does reinforce our collective school approach to local, national and global awareness of others.

Non-uniform days are a privilege due to student's high standards with regards to behaviour and daily uniform. To keep these standards high please remind your daughter that trousers must be navy, the correct length, must not be fitted and with no seam on the front. Students who cannot adhere to this will be requested to wear their skirt instead. Socks must be navy and shoes must not be trainers. If your daughter wears a skirt please ensure that she wears this appropriately and modestly therefore at knee length.
